THEME OF CME

Teacher as facilitator in competency based medical education

The erstwhile Medical Council of India (MCI), now National Medical Council (NMC) introduced the competency based medical education (CBME) curriculum in 2019. The intent of CBME is redefining the curriculum from teacher-centered learning to student-centered learning. The purpose was to bring about a change in the way the students perceived and connected to their learning by being active participants in their learning process. In this process there is a transition of the teacher's role from that of a transmitter of knowledge to a guide and facilitator. CBME has different modules such as foundation course, early clinical exposure, Attitude, Ethics and Communication (AETCOM), electives, alignment and integration of subjects and longitudinal care with emphasis on skill acquisition through mandatory certification of essential skills in each professional year. Similarly, formative and summative assessments have been designed to achieve the objectives of CBME.

With these objectives in mind, there has been ongoing training sessions of teachers at the nodal and regional centers on CBME. However, it is prudent to appreciate that we as teachers are still in the learner's curve phase, faced by several challenges of donning new educational roles as student facilitator, curriculum planner, performance observer and assessor. The transformation is happening as almost all the components are being implemented, however it is not smooth either due to the multiple roles that the teacher has to play as facilitator, the reluctance to change, need for more training, infrastructure and manpower issues just to name a few. This one-day CME is about reviewing our current understanding of the novel components of the CBME, and the inherent difficulties at the ground level, with sharing of thoughts and discussing the ways in which CBME can be conducted. At the end of the day, it is hoped that this CME will reinforce and enrich our knowledge regarding effective implementation of CBME.
