
Diagnosis

Parachute use to prevent death and major trauma related to gravitational challenge: systematic review of randomised controlled trials

Gordon CS Smith et al BMJ 2003



Parachutes reduce the risk of injury after gravitational challenge, but their effectiveness has not been proved with randomised controlled trials


What this study adds

No randomised controlled trials of parachute use have been undertaken

The basis for parachute use is purely observational, and its apparent efficacy could potentially be explained by a "healthy cohort" effect

Individuals who insist that all interventions need to be validated by a randomised controlled trial need to come down to earth with a bump




Complications




