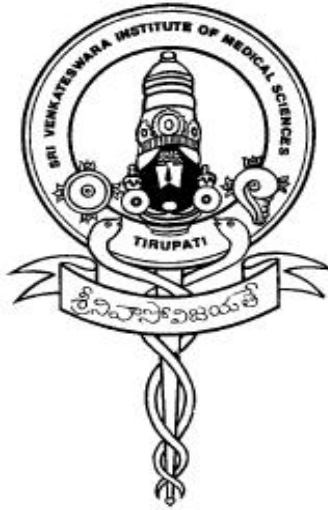

## 1. INTRODUCTION:

Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences (SVIMS), Tirupati, was established in the year 1993, under the aegis of Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams, as a modern super speciality hospital and was granted the status of a University in the year 1995 by an act of A.P. state legislature vide act no.12 of 1995. The objectives of the Institute are:

- i. To create a centre of excellence for providing medical care, education and research facilities of a high order in the field of medical sciences in the existing super specialities and such other super specialities as may develop in future, including continuing medical education and hospital administration.
- ii. To develop patterns of teaching in postgraduate level and in super specialities so as to set a high standard of medical education.
- iii. To provide for training in paramedical and allied fields, particularly in relation to super specialities.
- iv. To function as a referral hospital.
- v. To provide for UG & PG teaching and conduct of research in the relevant disciplines of modern medicine and other allied sciences, including inter-disciplinary fields of physical and biological sciences.

The institution, spread in 107.04 acre campus, is gradually growing into a prestigious university. Today, SVIMS has 37 super/broad speciality medical departments, three colleges and two inter- disciplinary departments and is developing into a centre of excellence for providing medical care, education and research activities of a high standard. In addition to these, SVIMS also provides training in para-medical and allied fields, particularly related to super-specialities.

The Institution is recognized by the University Grants Commission (UGC) under section 12 (B) of the UGC act, 1956, and the Medical Council of India (MCI) granted permission and later recognition to start DM/M.Ch. super-speciality courses in Cardiology, Neurology, Nephrology, Endocrinology, Medical Oncology, Cardiothoracic Surgery, Neurosurgery, Urology, Surgical Oncology, Surgical Gastroenterology and PG Medical (MD) courses in Anaesthesiology, Microbiology, Biochemistry, Emergency Medicine, General Surgery, Pathology, Medicine, Nuclear Medicine, Transfusion Medicine, Radio Diagnosis and Radiotherapy.

**The constituent colleges are:**

- i. **SVIMS, Sri Padmavathi Medical College for Women (SPMC-W)** : The college was permitted by govt. of India for admitting MBBS students with 150 annual intake w.e.f. 2014-15 academic year, and later increased to 175 w.e.f 2019-20. The admissions are carried out as per the GO. Ms No. 77, dt : 19.07.2019, HM & FW (C1) Dept., Govt. of AP. The college is one of the reputed institutions in Andhra Pradesh with good teaching faculty and infrastructure to impart teaching and training to the students. The admission process is carried out by Dr. NTR UHS, Vijayawada.
- ii. **College of Nursing:** The college of Nursing was established in the year 1996, with the objective of providing graduate, postgraduate teaching and for research in the relevant disciplines of modern nursing. Courses offered are B.Sc. (Nursing), M.Sc. (Nursing) and Ph.D. The college has excellent infrastructure with well-equipped laboratories, advanced teaching and learning activities. The Indian Nursing council recognized for B.Sc. (N) with intake of 100 students and M.Sc. (N) with intake of 30 students per annum.
- iii. **College of Physiotherapy:** The College of physiotherapy was established in the year 1998. The college offers graduate and postgraduate & Ph.D. courses in physiotherapy, in-patient and outpatient services and special services through obesity clinic, pain clinic, paediatrics clinic, advanced physiotherapy, ergonomics & life style modification. There are 55 seats in BPT and 17 seats in MPT after implementation of 10% EWS reservation.
- iv. **Allied Health Sciences:** The University started paramedical Diploma courses w.e.f. 1995-96 academic year for science graduates. At present there are 10 specialities and the duration of the course is 4 years. They are recognized by AP Paramedical Board.

**Interdisciplinary departments:**

- i. **Biotechnology:** The Department of Biotechnology was established in 2003. It offers two courses, MSc (Biotechnology) and PhD. The department has developed cardiomyocytes from human CD 34+ stem cells. The students have been selected in various national level examinations like, Biotech Consortium India Ltd. (BCIL), Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR), Graduate Aptitude Test in Engineering (GATE), Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) etc. The intake of students for M.Sc. Biotechnology is 17 in each academic year after implementation of 10% EWS reservation.
- ii. **Bioinformatics:** The Department of Bioinformatics established in 2003, is offering M.Sc. Bioinformatics and Ph.D. programmes. The students are selected in various National level examinations like GATE, ICMR, Bioinformatics Industrial Training Programme, New Delhi (BIITP). The DBT, ministry of science and technology, Govt. of India has sanctioned grants to the Bioinformatics centre to support teaching and research work. The Bioinformatics

centre offers two studentships to final semester M.Sc Bioinformatics students and two traineeships to M.Sc Bioinformatics students every year. The students selected under this scheme are awarded a stipend of Rs 8,000/- per month for a period of six months. The intake of students for M.Sc. Bioinformatics is 17 in each academic year after implementation of 10% EWS reservation.

- iii. **Center for Advanced Research (CfAR):** This is a advanced diagnostic and research facility established at SVIMS. This facility spans 36,000 sq. ft. built as G + 3 floors with potential to add 2 more floors. The facilities on each of the floors are designed in keeping with the cross cutting research themes and to launch path-breaking healthcare innovations. All essential core equipments are in various stages of being commissioned. The CfAR building is dedicated to population health research, clinical trials infrastructure, data management centre, Biostatistics and Epidemiology, facilities for research projects under the theme “Infection, Inflammation and Immunity”, Biobank, Regenerative Medicine, Islet cell transplantation, stem cell biology, Biotechnology and Bioinformatics. The Viral Research and Diagnostic Laboratory (VRDL) in the first floor is funded by ICMR.

The existing medical college level VRDL is approved to be upgraded to state level VRDL. The VRDL is offering free investigations for around 21 different common and rare viruses prevalent in the area including COVID 19. The lab has tested more than 1,75,000 patient samples for various acute and chronic viral infections across the state and from neighboring states. The lab also participates in outbreak investigations. Teams comprising experts from different medical fields visit outbreak sites to identify the causative agents and send the reports to the state as well as national health authorities. The lab helps in building national data required for development of various health schemes. VRDL is identified as one of the center for four national multi centric projects (2-completed and 2-ongoing). It conducts annual training on serological and molecular methods for detection of viruses. The CfAR building is also used for research purpose to the students of Allied health Sciences.

### 3. ADMISSION & TRAINING REGULATIONS:

#### I. Post Doctoral Fellowship (PDF) Courses

- The course duration is one year and **it is not recognized by MCI.**
- NOC:** The candidate who is already working as full time employee elsewhere has to submit No objection certificate (NOC) from the competent authority, to be enclosed along with the application. They have to produce the Relief order on the date of admission into the course. They are not permitted to be shown as teacher for MCI purpose in any other institution/s during the period of training. If violated, suitable action will be initiated. NOC Proforma is available in Annexure-I.
- Method of selection:** The qualified candidates will be called for assessment. The candidates will be selected (Based on viva- voce and interview).

\* The refundable deposits (07,08 in the table) are to be paid at the time of joining

- During the time of reporting for admission, the candidate has to pay Rs. 95,000/- (non refundable) and submit all the original certificates and Bond as specified in these regulations. In case, the candidate wants to cancel the admission the amount paid will not be refunded.
  - Further, the candidate has to pay the caution, hostel deposit & hostel corpus fund on the date of joining.
- e) **Date of Joining:** The selected candidates have to report to the HoD's concerned and join the programme on the date prescribed in the provisional admission order. Those who do not report within 05 days from the commencement of the course are liable for cancellation of admission without further notice

- f) **Training & evaluation:** There will not be any examination at the end of the year of training. Trainees have to maintain a log book and submit dissertation work certified by the Head of the Department (10 cases) for issue of certificate. He/she shall attend at least one conference and present a paper in the conference. The Fellowship certificate will be issued only after the production of such documents.
- g) **Bond:** The selected candidate has to execute a bond for Rs. 50000/- in Rs.100/- non-judicial stamp paper stating that he/she will complete the course, failing which the bond amount and the total stipend received by him/her up to the date of discontinuation will be returned to the institution. The bond proforma is available in Annexure – II.
- h) **Stipend:** The stipend will be paid for the students on par with 1<sup>st</sup> year DM/MCh students, limited to the no. of Senior Resident vacancies available in that speciality as per the rules of the Institute in force. In-service candidate will not be paid stipend.
- i) The candidates selected for Fellowship programmes may be posted in other specialities also, if required.
- j) Priority will be given to Andhra Pradesh/ Telangana.

## II. Certificate Courses for Medical Graduates

- a) The course duration is one year and **not recognized by MCI.**
- b) **NOC:** The candidate who is already working as full time employee has to submit a No objection certificate (NOC) from the competent authority, to be enclosed along with the application. They have to produce the relief order on the date of admission into the course. They are not permitted to be shown as resident for MCI purpose in any other institution/s during the training period. If violated, suitable action will be initiated. Stipend will be paid as per the institution norms during the training period.
- c) **Method of selection:** The qualified candidates will be called for assessment. The candidates will be selected based on viva-voce and interview.

1. During the time of reporting for admission, the candidate has to pay total fee of Rs. 30,700/- and submit all the original certificates and Bond as specified in these regulations.
  2. Further, the candidate has to pay the caution, hostel deposit & hostel corpus fund on the date of joining.
- e) **Date of Joining:** The selected candidates have to report to the HoD's concerned and join the programme on the date prescribed in the provisional admission order. Those who do not report within 05 days from the commencement of the course are liable for cancellation of admission without further notice.
- f) **Training & Evaluation:** The candidates who are admitted in Emergency Medicine will be trained in the Dept. of Emergency Medicine under the control of the Head of the Department. Similarly, the candidates who join for Basics of Dialysis Management course will be trained in the Dept. of Nephrology under the control of the Head of the Department. The training will be provided in both Hemo & Peritoneal Dialysis.
- g) The students have to maintain a log book (record) during the training period. The same has to be submitted to the Controller of Examinations through HoD along with course completion certificate. The training programme is not recognized by MCI.
- h) **Bond:** The selected candidate has to execute a bond for Rs. 50000/- in Rs.100/- non-judicial stamp paper stating that he/she will complete the course, failing which the bond amount and the total stipend received up to the date of discontinuation by him/her will be returned to the institution. The bond proforma is available in **Annexure - II**.
- i) **Stipend:** Monthly stipend as per SVIMS rules shall be paid to the candidate admitted in certificate course for medical graduates courses for a period not exceeding 12 months taking their monthly attendance into consideration. As per the existing norms, they are paid of Rs.35,000/- per month. In-service candidate will not be paid stipend.
- j) Priority will be given to Andhra Pradesh/ Telangana.

#### 4. APPLICATION

##### I. Availability :

##### II. Instructions for filling the application :

- a) Application form shall be filled up carefully by the applicant in her/his own handwriting in BLOCK LETTERS and no column shall be left blank or incomplete. Defective applications will be rejected and no further intimation will be given to the applicant.



- b) All information given in the application form should be correct. Any false information or suppression of any factual information in the application would be a disqualification. In case, any false information is furnished or that suppression of any factual information comes to the notice during any time of the course, he/she would be liable for termination, besides other actions by the institution, as may be deemed fit.
- c) Full name of the candidate mentioned as MBBS certificate shall be written in the application and all other related certificates shall also be enclosed and the address for correspondence shall be specified.
- d) The name of the course for which application is made should be prominently specified on the top of the relevant column of the application.
- e) All claims made in the application must be supported with documentary proof.

### III. Application Submission:

- a) The filled-in application form along with the photo copies of relevant certificates and DD for Rs. 750/- drawn from a nationalized bank in favour of the Director, SVIMS, Tirupati payable at Tirupati or online payment in the name of **Director, SVIMS University, Tirupati**, State Bank of India, A/C No.: 52089535266, SVIMS branch, IFSC CODE: SBIN0020926, shall be sent by post or in person or email so as to reach **The Registrar, Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences, Alipiri Road, Tirupati - 517 507, e-mail: [svimsadmissions@gmail.com](mailto:svimsadmissions@gmail.com)** on or before the last date specified in the prospectus. Applications received after 5:00 pm on the last date will not be entertained. The university is not responsible for the loss of application in transit or postal delay.
- b) Application without payment will be rejected. Bank challans, cheques, postal orders and money orders will not be accepted.
- c) It is the responsibility of the candidates to ascertain whether they possess the requisite qualification for admission. Having been called for the written test/counseling does not mean acceptance of eligibility. Based on the rank obtained in the entrance / academic merit in the qualifying examination, the eligible candidates will be informed to appear for counseling. The university will not reimburse any expenditure incurred by the candidate to attend for the counseling. Selection of the candidate will not be final unless the original certificates are verified, found correct and the fee is paid.
- d) Late or incomplete applications without necessary enclosures will be rejected.
- e) The decision of the selection committee is final.
- f) The course duration is one year and is not recognized by the MCI. The candidate has to obtain P.G. qualification before the last date for application, otherwise he/she has to submit a declaration that he/she will submit the copy of the P.G. degree on or before the date of counseling for receipt of the call letter.

## 5. GENERAL REGULATIONS

### I. INSTRUCTIONS:

- a) Candidates are advised to send their application form(s) preferably by registered post. The institute takes no responsibility for any delay in the receipt or loss of application in transit.
- b) Employees of state or central govt. or of any public sector undertaking of state or central govt. shall send their applications through their employer. However, the advance copy of the application (complete in all respects) may be sent to avoid delay. In case, the application is not received through the employer before the date, "No objection certificate" from the employer shall be produced at the time of entrance test / counseling failing which the candidate will not be allowed.
- c) Candidates called for entrance test and counseling will have to make their own arrangements. No TA/DA will be paid by the institution.
- d) The decision of the Head of the institute shall be final in all the matters of selection and admission to various courses and no appeal shall be entertained on this subject.
- e) All courses are conducted on full time basis. The candidates are strictly not permitted to undertake any other full time, part time or correspondence courses.
- f) All candidates admitted to the institute shall maintain good conduct, carry out assignments, attend their classes/training regularly and abide by the regulations of the institute.
- g) Selected candidates have to submit migration certificate from the university from which they have passed the last qualifying examination, at the time of joining the institute.
- h) The candidates are requested to keep themselves updated by visiting the university website regularly from time to time or keeping in touch with the academic/examination section of SVIMS.
- i) The rules and regulations in this prospectus are subject to change in accordance with the decision of the institute from time to time.
- j) **Medical Fitness:** Admission to the programme for the year is subject to being found medically fit by the medical board of SVIMS.
- k) **WARNING:** In case any candidate is found to have submitted false information or certificate or is found to have withheld or concealed any information, he/she shall be debarred from continuing the course and shall face such appropriate action initiated against him/her by the Head of the Institute.

### 6. DISCIPLINE AMONG STUDENTS:

All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action in relation to the students of the University are vested with the Director cum Vice Chancellor. VC may delegate all or any of the powers as deems proper to any of the officers of the University.

The candidates shall maintain strict discipline during the period of study/training programme in terms of conduct rules of the institute. The candidates shall not resort to any strikes during the period of their study. Use of alcohol, banned drugs, drug trafficking and eve teasing and any other criminal offences, are strictly prohibited in the campus and students found indulging in such activities will be subjected to strict disciplinary action as per the law. Indulging in any criminal activity within or outside the University and any physical violence against colleagues/ students / residents will attract stern disciplinary action including rustication.

The candidates are not permitted to approach the print or electronic media for redressal of their grievances, this amount to indiscipline. They are not permitted to approach legal authorities / INC/ MCI / Govt. etc., without prior permission from the institution. In case of violation of the conduct rules, the admission of the candidate is liable for cancellation apart from disciplinary action by the institute.

A Committee is constituted by the university to combat the menace of violence against women and sexual harassment in the campus as per the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India guidelines. Suitable action will be taken by the committee based on their report against the student who is involved in such activity.

## **7. BAN ON RAGGING IN THE CAMPUS:**

As per the orders of the "Hon'ble Supreme Court of India" if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority of the University, he/she who has indulged in such incident shall be given opportunity to explain and if his/her explanation is not satisfactory, the authority would expel him/her from the University besides making entry in his certificates to that effect. Apart from the above, the students are liable for a fine up to Rs.50,000/-, rigorous imprisonment up to three years (by court of law), and other punishments as per the Act.No.26 of 1997, dated 21-08-1997 of State of Andhra Pradesh.

The disciplinary committee constituted by the university shall examine all the disciplinary and related issues pertaining to the students. The misconduct /indiscipline related cases shall be brought to the notice of the Dean. Based on the gravity of the case, the committee shall make appropriate recommendations for further action.

After admission, each candidate has to submit an affidavit duly signed by self and parent /guardian. The affidavit is available in the website [www.amanmovement.org](http://www.amanmovement.org).

## **8. GAMES AND SPORTS:**

The institute is promoting the sports and games culture among the student community by organizing coaching camps in various disciplines for the University teams. The University is member of Association of Indian universities (AIU) and students participate in Inter University Zonal and All India level Tournaments regularly. Further, the University organizes annual competitions to inspire the student community to involve in sports and games to improve their health status.

## **9. CENTRAL FACILITIES:**

### **I. Library:**

There is a well established library with a collection of 11529 books with subscription for 159 print journals (85 foreign and 74 Indian). It has a back volume journal collection of 6865 dating back to 1993. It is having e-library facility with 35 nodes for browsing internet for the use of faculty, P.G. and U.G. students. Library is kept open for 363 days in a year except on January, 26th and August 15th and functions 16 hours a day i.e. 8.00 A.M. to 12.00 Midnight. During festival holidays and Sundays, library is kept open from 10.00 A.M to 5.00 P.M. All the library services are automated by adopting KOHA library automation software.

The National medical Library, New Delhi providing membership in ERMED consortium to access 239+ e-journals with back issues.

The library is functioning from Feb' 2017 in the new building with State-of the – art facilities in 42000 Sq. ft built up area.

## **II. Hostel Accommodation:**

- a) Shared accommodation will be provided to the candidates on a rent fixed as per rules of the institute, subject to availability. They will have to necessarily stay in the accommodation, if provided by the institute.
- b) The students are required to vacate the hostel accommodation within seven days of the completion of their course failing which Rs.100/- and Rs.200/- per day will be levied for bachelor and married hosteller respectively as penal rent for unauthorized occupancy of hostel accommodation. Under such circumstances, the room will be vacated/evicted by the hostel authority / security staff during the unauthorized stay.
- c) The students will be responsible for proper upkeep of the furniture and other fixtures of the room. In case of damage/loss, a penalty would be imposed as assessed by the wardens of the hostels.
- d) No electrical/civil alteration in the room is allowed.
- e) Use of air-conditioner/ heaters and other electrical appliances consuming high electrical energy is not allowed in the hostel.
- f) The mess charges shall be borne by the students apart from the hostel establishment charges as applicable. At the time of allotment of hostel, the candidate has to pay 01 year mess charges & establishment charges in advance.

## **III. Training**

Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati impart training through attached super specialty hospital and Sri Padmavathi Medical College Hospital.

Presently, both hospitals together have 1094 beds capacity. For the year 2019; 5,50,635 out patients visited, 46,054 in-patients were admitted and 14,218 patients underwent surgeries in both the hospitals. The Institute performed 23,54,454 investigations.

SVIMS ensures that teaching methods employed, facilities and content of the programs are in line with the latest innovations with a strong science base. The Institute promotes teaching and training through seminars, didactic lectures and wide range of clinical and laboratory experiences, independent thinking and relevant research.

The students are provided hands on training in the State-of-Art equipments available in the Institute under the supervision of senior technologists and faculty. They are not permitted to handle the equipment and patients independently. In the event of causing damage to the equipment or accessories or misbehaving with the patients will lead to stern disciplinary action apart from recovery of the damage caused.

## **IV. Private Practice:**

Private practice or consultations is not allowed and student should not accept any part time employment in any state or central or Quasi Government or private organizations during the period of training. If this rule is violated, appropriate action shall be taken after giving opportunity for explanation.

## V. Powers of Dean :

Not with standing anything contained therein, the Dean, SVIMS may at any time before completion of the course either on his/her own motion or on the application of any person after due and proper enquiry and after giving the person two weeks time from the date of receipt of the show cause notice to submit the written explanation and on personal hearing, order the cancellation of admission to the course, if in his/her opinion such candidate had furnished in correct particulars/false information in the application or in the documents attached there to or in the statement made either before the authority in charge of admission or the Dean or any other manner. Against any such order of the Dean, the appeal shall lie with the Director- cum-VC, SVIMS, Tirupati.

*Note: The confirmation of the admission is subject to the outcome of any litigation pending before any Court of Law in the Republic of India.*
