What began 25 years ago, a dream come true of its founder late Sri. Dr. N. T. Rama Rao garu, the then Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh to start a "Hospital of Superspecialties" to serve the needy at the feet of Lord Balaji, with 6 superspecialties, 200 beds, about 24,000 annual outpatient visits with 30 faculty and 165 staff, SVIMS is now a health system with 1094 beds (soon to be around 1500 by end of 2018), over 5 ½ lakh outpatient visits, superspecialty and broad specialty training programs in all specialties totaling 66 courses, medical, nursing, physiotherapy colleges, a large allied health sciences program, research wing, and the largest community outreach enterprise in the state, with nearly 200 faculty, and around 2200 staff. We will soon reach a student strength of 2000.

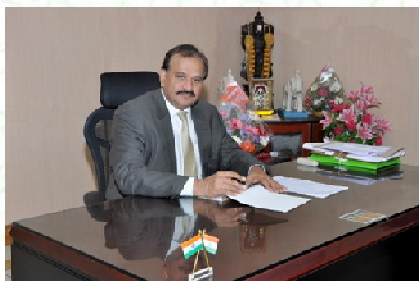

As part of SVIMS Silver Jubilee Celebrations, the Department of Surgical Oncology organized SVIMS Silver Jubilee live Laparoscopic Oncosurgical Workshop (SSJLOW – 2018) on February 23rd and 24th – 2018 which is first of its kind in the entire Rayalaseema region. SVIMS is the only centre in Rayalaseema offering comprehensive cancer care with Surgical, Medical and Radiation Oncology services.

Dr. T. Subramanyeshwar Rao, MS, MCh (Surg. Onco), Medical Director, Basava Tarakam Indo American Cancer Institute, Hyderabad demonstrated Laparoscopic surgeries on Gastrointestinal and Gynaecological malignancies live. SVIMS Director and Vice Chancellor, Dr. T.S. Ravikumar was the organising Chairman and Dr. H. Narendra, Professor & HOD, Department of Surgical Oncology was the Organising Secretary. SVIMS Ranked among the Top 100 Universities in India by NIRF

SVIMS achieved a new milestone in April 2018 when in its maiden attempt at the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF); it was ranked as the 62nd best university in the country and in the “overall” category it was ranked at 89 (out of a hold of 957 entries in this category).

The faculty council of SVIMS felicitated the Director cum Vice Chancellor, Prof. T.S.Ravikumar, the Dean Prof. P.V.L.N. Srinivasa Rao and Prof. V. Suresh, the Nodal Officer for the NIRF ranking for this wonderful achievement.

Only four other universities based in Andhra Pradesh have achieved this distinction of being ranked among the top 100 in the country.

First SVIMS Alumni Meet Organized

Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences organized its first Alumni Meet on 25.02.2018. More than 100 alumni of SVIMS serving in different capacities all across the globe participated in this meet. Three Alumni Associations of SVIMS were formed in the disciplines of Modern Medicine; Physiotherapy & Nursing and Allied Health Sciences respectively. **SVIMS Alumni Chronicle** was released and is available in the SVIMS website.

A Continued Medical Education (CME) program was organized on this occasion. Dr. Deepa Iyengar, Associate Professor, Family and Community Medicine, University of Texas addressed the gathering through video conferencing about obesity and diabetes affecting Indians across boundaries. She interacted with students and encouraged them to take up research in public health. She promised to work towards cooperation with SVIMS through an MoU mode under a Global Initiative for Health for learning about differences in patterns of treatment across countries for chronic illness.

SVIMS Alumni made presentations on different topics. The following is the brief of their talks.



Dr.Sai Naresh, Nephrologist, Vishakapatnam

Discussed the ways in which kidney transplant can be popularised in India with examples from Spain and Iran where transplant program is now well established. He emphasised that transplant is ultimately more cost-effective than continuing dialysis in patients with kidney disease.

Dr. N.S. Sampath, Prof. of Neurology, Narayana Medical College, Nellore

Discussed about the application of Botulinum toxin (BOTOX) in different neurological conditions associated with muscle spasm. (Eg: Writers cramp)

Dr. Madhavi, Assistant Prof. of Radio diagnosis at CMC Vellore

Discussed about the advances in Radiology including greater specialization, digital display, artificial intelligence and community outreach. She congratulated SVIMS on starting the cancer screening program through the “Pink Bus” initiative.

Dr. Srinivas Bolleneni, University of Texas, South Western Medical Centre, Dallas, Texas, USA

Dr. Govini Balasubramani, Global Hospitals, Chennai.

Talked about their collaboration over the last two years in the field of Lung Transplantation. They expressed their commitment to develop lung and critical care facilities in SVIMS including these for care of chronic lung disorders leading on to lung transplant.



Dr. Arun Raja, Associate Prof. of Medicine at SVIMS

Talked about recent developments in sepsis. “Sepsis should be defined as life-threatening organ dysfunction caused by a dysregulated host response to infection. For clinical operationalization, organ dysfunction can be represented by an increase in the Sequential [Sepsis-related] Organ Failure Assessment (SOFA) score of 2 points or more, which is associated with an in-hospital mortality greater than 10%”. Said Dr. Arun Raja. He also discussed about septic shock.

Syamala Buragadda, Researcher, King Saud University

Discussed the determinants of professional development; Continuous Medical Education (CME), Career path specializations; Evidence based Medicine (EBM) and Research. Highlighted various steps in evidence based medicine and its integration to clinical practice and gave an overview of facilitators and barriers of research in the field of Medicine.

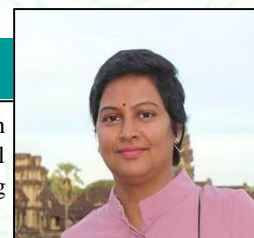


Dr. M. Lokeswari, Vice – Principal, Aragonda Apollo College of Nursing

Explained the use of E-Governance in Nursing Practice. She emphasized on how the adoption of smart, standard -based interoperable technology can make health care delivery safer, more efficient, timely, accessible, and patient centered.

Dr. A. Naganjani, Asso. Professor, PICOMS College, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia

Gave a presentation on ‘Clinical Performance Tool’ which is a instrument that has been developed to evaluate the clinical performance of students as a measure of competency. This tool provides a comprehensive method in evaluating student’s performance in clinical setting by using various “Domains”.



Dr Srinivas, Head of Dept., Spectrum Physio Pvt. Ltd., Bangalore

Discussed about Treatment based & Movement based Classification of Spinal Dysfunction. He quoted the example of American Physical Therapy Association (APTA) which has linked the Clinical Practice Guidelines to the ICD-10 and also with ICF codes for better communication and also to describe evidence-based physical therapy practice including diagnosis, prognosis, intervention, and assessment of outcome for musculoskeletal disorders commonly managed by Orthopaedic Physical Therapists.

Hon'ble Minister for Health and Medical Education, A.P., Dr. Kamineni Srinivas garu inaugurated SVIMS Simulation / Skill Centre and **American Heart Association (AHA)** designated **International Training Centre (ITC)** on 20th February, 2018.

SVIMS AHA—IT was formed with an aim



to impart training in ECC (AHA American Heart Association Emergency Cardiovascular Care) courses and provider and instructor courses in Basic Life Support (BLS) and Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) to all medical professionals.

SVIMS AHA-ITC is established in 5,000 sq. ft area with a cost of Rs. 6 crores sourced by TTD's Sri Balaji Arogya Varaprasadini Scheme.

Speaking in the inauguration program Hon'ble Minister for Health and Medical Education, A.P., said "SVIMS and NTRUHS are the two AHA-ITC centers in Andhra Pradesh and I congratulate SVIMS for establishing simulation system and AHA-ITC centre".

The first BLS and ACLS training course was conducted from 16th-18th February, 2018. SVIMS invited expert faculty of AHA courses from around the country to launch its first set of BLS & ACLS courses. Dr. Sachin Menon, Professor of Medicine and Vice Principal of Sree Narayana Institute of Medical Sciences, Calicut was the leader for core faculty of this training program. Dr. Vinay Pandit from JIPMER, Dr. E. Rajkumar from Hyderabad, Dr. J. Gowtham from Vijayawada were the other trained faculty for AHA courses. SVIMS

faculty Dr. Rajashekhar, HOD, Cardiology, Dr. Alok Samantaray, HOD, Anaesthesiology, Dr. N. Hemanth, Associate Professor Anaesthesiology Dr. V. Chandrashekhar, Asst. Prof. Community Medicine and Dr. Girija Kumari, Department of Anaesthesia, BIRRD Hospital, were the AHA certified instructors for 22 trainees each for BLS & ACLS. The trainees included Doctors, Nurses & technicians.



The provider course will equip the doctors with the skills that enable them to resuscitate cardiac arrest victims and other critical events such as respiratory arrest & stroke victims more efficiently. The course content is designed in such a way that it gives a complete overview of current resuscitation concepts. Those receiving training were certified as BLS and ACLS providers by AHA. SVIMS-AHA-ITC plans to carry out the training sessions at regular intervals for all health care institutions in the region.

SVIMS Initiated CPR training in Tirupati to make it as "CPR Smart City" wherein its citizens have the knowledge, skill and readiness to help out any fellow human being requiring life saving procedure before the appropriate medical help arrives. In view of the above theme and with the following quote **"get trained, save a life, you'll be glad you did"**, SVIMS students & faculty have been training citizens of Tirupati since January, 2018.

"Being able to perform CPR empowers people to take a bold step and save a life. If a person experiencing heart attack or shock receives CPR in the first few minutes before the appropriate medical help arrives, then the chances of his/ her survival is more" opined SVIMS Director and Vice Chancellor Dr. T.S. Ravikumar

SVIMS has been successful in training more than 10,000 people in this life saving procedure. Under the leadership of Dr.T.S.Ravikumar, Dr. Alok Samantaray, HOD, Anesthesiology, Dr. Madhavi, Principal, Physiotherapy coordinated CPR events in many institutes of Tirupati. Students and faculty of Physiotherapy & Nursing Colleges, Anesthesiology Department, Emergency Medicine etc played an active role in imparting training in CPR to the people.

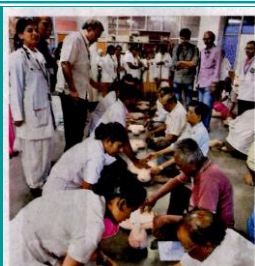

SVIMS adapted an innovative approach called bundled screening to screen all men and women for cancers. Screening for Breast and Cervix cancer in women and cancers of oral cavity, Lung, Liver and other sites in both men and women were conducted in the medical camp.

3 Goal Posts of SVIMS

- Diagnosing cancer cases at an early stage and reducing cancer deaths.
- Increasing the cure rate
- Reducing the cancer burden within 10 years

Along with Cancer screening, screening for Diabetes, High Blood pressure, Heart and Kidney ailments and obesity were also carried out. By midday over 800 people had been screened, necessary medicines given free and appropriate medical treatment and referrals provided.

SVIMS Clinic:

SVIMS Clinic was established at a cost of Rs.8.65 lakhs. It will facilitate office based outpatient consultative services for 12 different specialties and 5 testing rooms for immediate investigations under one roof.

Green Generator :

The generator room extension has two generators and panel boards developed with a cost of Rs.122 crores. This facility is meant to provide stand by power supply to Dialysis block.

Indoor Substation:

The indoor substation is developed at a cost of Rs.2.58 crores. This facility replaces 3 substations already existing in SVIMS and will also be helpful in reducing power charges.

DEEP BRAIN STIMULATION PROCEDURES PERFORMED FOR PARKINSON'S PATIENT AT SVIMS

SVIMS Neurosurgery team with the help of doctors from M. S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore, performed Deep Brain Stimulation surgical procedure for a patient suffering from Parkinson's and the surgery was successful. SVIMS is first to perform this complex procedure in Andhra Pradesh. The cost of surgery was funded by TTD under Pranadanam Scheme.

Deep Brain Stimulation

● It is a neurosurgical procedure involving the implantation of a medical device called a neurostimulator (also called brain pace maker), which sends electrical impulses, through implanted electrodes, to specific targets in the brain for the treatment of movement and neuropsychiatric disorders.

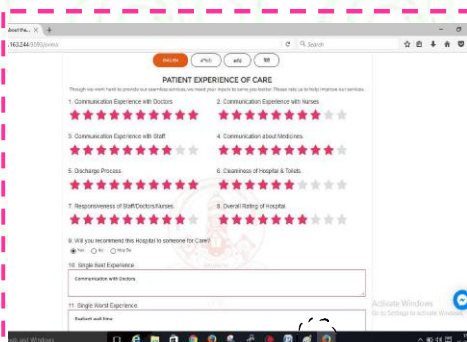

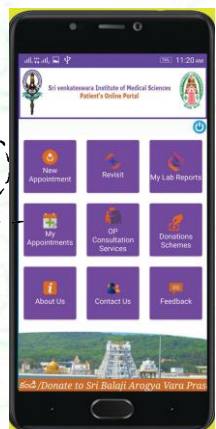

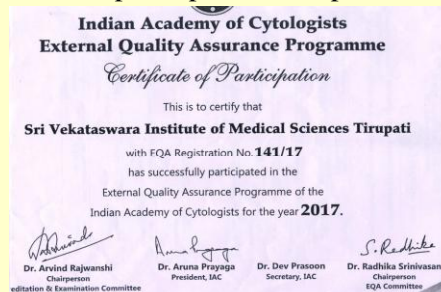

SVIMS faculty, nurses, staff and students packed Padmavathi Auditorium in a standing room only Patient Safety session, with a talk “Escape Fire & the Artful Science of Patient Safety” given by SVIMS Director and Vice Chancellor Dr.T.S.Ravikumar. This session was aptly

conducted following the regularly scheduled biweekly hospital mortality meeting. SVIMS Director and Vice Chancellor Dr. Ravikumar titled the talk as above, to portray the burning issue of preventable hospital deaths in India, as well as to recount the seminal talk of Dr.Donald Berwick, USA (“Escape Fire”), which has become a classic in health care quality. He reviewed the admonition Dr. Berwick gave in 1999 that was the “call to action” for preventing health care associated harm. This review of “Escape Fire” was followed by, what Dr. T. S. Ravikumar called the “Grammar and Prose of Patient Safety” language, describing various definitions and domains in patient safety. The third part of the session focused on the “Science of Patient Safety” including innovation in predictive modeling, outcome – based rounding and timely response to “rescue” patients before life threatening deterioration. Effective communication strategies were discussed and patient – centered care was emphasized.

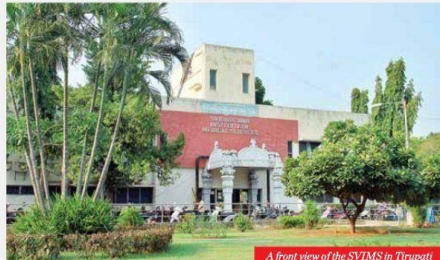

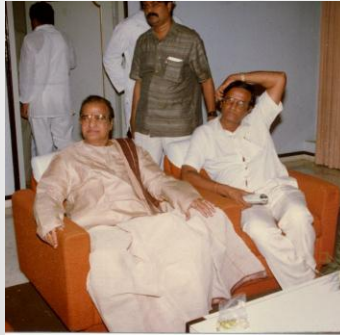
